## **First Presbyterian Church**

### **Corvallis OR**

Over a two-year period, Pioneer is providing numerous services to the 1928 section of this multi-building church campus. Extensive work includes rebuilding and securing the precast stone gable, repointing and replacing broken or cracked brick, installing new window ledger irons and removing roof coping metal on the tower and lower radius while waterproofing and stabilizing the brick work below the coping metal. They will also install new coping metal and repoint 50% of the brick mortar in the lower radius. The project will finish up with a complete masonry cleaning.

In addition, they completed a seismic upgrade to the 1910 section. Project is on track for a January 2024 completion.

## Orcas Island Moran State Park - Tower Ceiling

**Historic Restoration**

Built in 1935, the tower on Mount Constitution takes center stage on the highest point in the San Juan Islands and is the star of Moran State Park. Visitors to the 53-foot fire lookout/observation tower are rewarded with

spectacular 360-degree panoramic views of the islands and on clear days, Mount Rainier. Pioneer was retained to provide a unique repair to the inside of the 88 yr. old tower ceiling. Talented Pioneer employee Stephen Sedlar developed a design and methodology to re-create the unique concrete ceiling tile impressions incorporating cedar branches. Work is underway this summer.



## **Nike World Headquarters**

**Beaverton, OR** 



For ten distinct, multi-story buildings at the Nike World Headquarters, crews power washed each building and then sealed the precast concrete as well as cutting out and recaulking control and window joints asneeded. With an average crew size of twelve men and women, Pioneer logged more than 21,000 hours on this 15-month project.

One of Pioneer's more extensive traffic coating projects, the top level of this 7-story parking garage had the existing traffic coating removed and a new traffic coating system applied. New sealants and slab joints were



applied to levels two through six. Finally, a new traffic coating system was applied around all the perimeter edges. After some supply delays the project will wrap up this summer.

## **Getting to Know Sara Stone**

### Tell us about the path to your role today as a Project Manager?
